
ASSOCIATION OF MONTEREY BAY AREA GOVERNMENTS



- Long range plan for transportation investments
- Federal and state law requires that an MTP/SCS be prepared every four years
- Must provide a 20+ year horizon planning period
- Detailed work program and schedule approved in April 2023
- 2050 MTP/SCS scheduled for adoption in June 2026
- Highlight a number of key components completed and currently under development



- Finalizing the data needed to calculate the performance measures to be included in the 2050 MTP/SCS







- AMBAG worked with the RTPAs, transit operators, Caltrans, and local jurisdictions to finalize the draft project list for the 2050 MTP/SCS
- Project list updates including revising existing 2045 MTP/SCS projects, adding new projects or identifying those projects that that have been completed since the last MTP/SCS
- An updated project list has been submitted from each RTPA to AMBAG for inclusion in the MTP/SCS



Financial Assumptions

- Developed financial assumptions for the MTP/SCS through 2050
- Reasonably available local, state, and federal funding






 PlaceTypes are a set of land use designations common to general plans for all local jurisdictions in the AMBAG region


- PlaceTypes Maps
 - Update for 2022, 2035, and 2050
 - Local jurisdictions provide input on changes
 - Will be analyzed using the new land use model








- Opportunity Areas are locations that have the highest opportunity for successful sustainable growth
 - Generally located where transit priority areas and economic development areas overlap
 - Existing/Planned or Potential
- AMBAG is working with local jurisdictions to update the Opportunity Areas maps for existing/planned and potential areas
- Will use similar update process as PlaceType maps





Revenue Constrained Scenario

- Revenue Constrained Scenario = transportation projects + land use
- Evaluate using the Regional Travel Demand Model and Board approved performance measures
- Basis for the 2050 MTP/SCS and its EIR





- Continue to implement the outreach strategies included in the Board adopted Public Involvement Plan
- Public workshops and other outreach activities will be held in spring 2025 on the development of the 2050 MTP/SCS



- Continue to implement the 2050 MTP/SCS work plan components, including finalizing the project list and land use mapping for the Draft 2050 MTP/SCS and conduct public outreach activities
- Staff will be back to the Board of Directors periodically this spring for input and direction
